PGY2 Critical Care Pharmacy Residency



PGY2 Program Purpose

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification, if available.

Program description

The PGY2 Critical Care Residency Program is a 12-month program located at M Health Fairview University of Minnesota Medical Center and M Health Fairview University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital. This program prepares the resident to become a critical care clinical pharmacist through an array of advanced ICU-focused core and elective rotations.

Required Rotations

- Cardiovascular Critical Care (four weeks)
- Critical Care Clinical Leadership (three weeks)
- Emergency medicine (four weeks)
- Initial training (five weeks)
- Major project (longitudinal, 11 months)
- Medical Intensive Care (eight weeks)
- Neuro Critical Care (four weeks)
- OR Experience (two weeks)
- Pediatric Critical Care (four weeks)
- Staffing clinical practice (longitudinal, 11 months) - Residents work every third weekend (6,8, 10-hour shifts) and some holidays.
- Surgical Intensive Care (six weeks)
- Teaching assistant (longitudinal, one semester, 4 months) or didactic lectures at the college of pharmacy

- Antimicrobial Stewardship Team (if not PGY1) (four weeks)
- ICU Nephrology (three weeks)

- Lean/Fairview operating system (longitudinal, 9 months)
- Neonatal Intensive Care (four weeks)

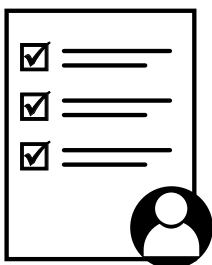
