PGY2 Pediatric Pharmacy Residency



Program Overview

The PGY2 Pediatric Residency Program is a 12-month program located at M Health Fairview University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital. This program prepares the resident to become a pediatric clinical pharmacist through an array of advanced pediatric-focused core and elective rotations.

At the M Health Fairview University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital, we balance the latest in technology and treatments with patient-centered care. We provide care for a broad spectrum of pediatrics, ranging from general surgery to NICU/PICU to cardiac services to oncology/BMT. As the core teaching hospital of the University of Minnesota Medical School and College of Pharmacy, our hospital is among the most respected in the nation, providing superior health care results. This program will provide development in clinical and problem-solving skills as well as communication, leadership, and teaching in pediatrics.

Program Purpose

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification, if available.

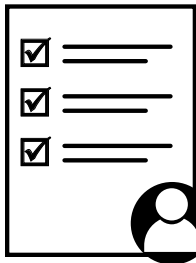
