Staffing

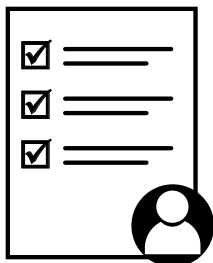
- Residents work every third weekend, two scheduled night shifts in three weeks and some holidays with Fairview Home Infusion
